### STEP 1: Language/Culture

Language competency; you must study one of the major South Asian languages. These include Hindi, Urdu, bengali, Tamil, and Telugu. You must study in a summer intensive language program before you leave for South Asia, and you must continue your language study while abroad. If you already know a South Asian language, then you must study a second South Asian language.

### STEP 2: Regional Specialization

Three courses with exclusive or primarily South Asian content, in at least two different disciplines. No double counting of courses in your disciplinary specialization nor your language.

### STEP 3: Study Abroad

Study abroad in South Asia, preferably for a year but at least for one semester. Students must receive the approval of relevant departments and/or, as appropriate, the director of South Asian studies to receive major credit for courses taken abroad.

### STEP 4: Senior Program

Either a senior international studies seminar (INTL 04XX), or students may also propose to write a two-semester honors thesis (INTL 0707) in their senior year. A thesis is required for honors. Students must have a 3.5 average or better in all courses that count for the major to apply to write an honors thesis. No exceptions will be made to these requirements.
