# ARTEMIS CONSTITUTION

---

- Article I      Name  
The name of the organization is Artemis.
- Article II      Purpose  
The purpose of the proposed publication would include the following:
1. To create a consistent feminist voice for the entire College community, which would be aimed at the entire student body in the format of a bi-annual publication.
  2. To provide information about feminism and about topics which are of interest to women (e.g. sexual harassment, birth control, government policies concerning women's rights, etc.)
  3. To publish information about women and men on campus who are concerned about issues of sexual equality, as well as publish information on local and national issues.
  4. To promote equity between the sexes and to dispel gender-related stereotypes.
- Article III      Membership  
The staff of ARTEMIS will consist of:
1. Two elected co-editors or one elected editor.
  2. Other elected editors, as determined necessary by the co-editors in chief.
  3. The publication would be open to all interested Middlebury College Students.
  4. Contributions from students, faculty and people outside the College community would be welcome.
- Article IV      Elections  
The editor and other positions shall be elected by the membership by March 15<sup>th</sup> by a two-thirds majority of the membership with a quorum of at least 75%. The length of the term for all officers shall be one school year. The vote shall take place by secret ballot.
- Article V      Meetings  
Meetings shall be called as necessary to publish the magazine. During the meetings, staff members will discuss the upcoming issue. Staff members will approve proposed articles and other items for publication.
- Article VI      Advisor  
The staff may recommend to the President of the College for appointment a member of the faculty or staff to act as advisor.
- Article VII      Ratification
1. The constitution must be ratified by a two-thirds majority of the membership.
  2. The Student Government Constitution Committee must approve the constitution.
- Article VII      Amendments
1. Amendments to the constitution must be ratified by a two-thirds majority of the membership.
  2. The Student Government Constitution Committee must approve amendments to the constitution.
