STEP 3: Study Abroad

Study abroad in China or Japan, preferably for a year but at least for one semester. Students must receive the approval

of relevant departments and/or, as appropriate, the director of East Asian studies to receive major credit for courses taken abroad. Study abroad must be in the language of study at Middlebury.

STEP 4: Senior Program

An upper-level course, preferably two, in the language of emphasis that will be taken after returning from abroad. The language departments will determine which courses can be taken to fulfill this requirement, in consultation
