To Rock

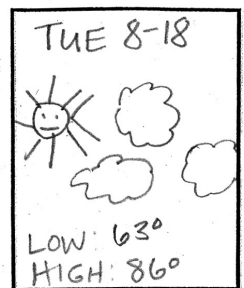
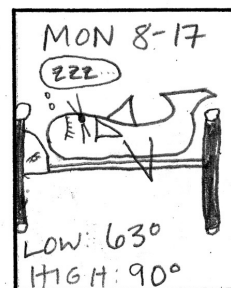
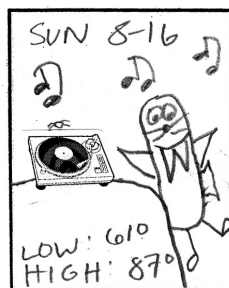
