

Page 1 Literacy Project

- Article I Name: The name of this organization shall be the Page 1 Literacy Project.
- Article II Purpose: The purpose of the organization is as follows:
1. To promote a greater understanding of the cause and effects of illiteracy on society in Addison County.
 2. To provide opportunities for direct involvement in promoting literacy through volunteering in Addison County.
 3. To provide educational opportunities related to literacy through guest speakers and authors in Addison County.
- Article III Membership: Membership in the Page 1 Literacy Project shall be open to all interested Middlebury College students, faculty, and staff.
- Article IV Officers: Officers for the Page 1 Literacy Project shall be Middlebury College students in good standing as follows
- Campus Co-Chair: Responsible for overseeing all on-campus Page 1 events.
 - Community Co-Chair: Responsible for overseeing all Page 1 community-based programs; program chairman for each.
 - Treasurer: Acts as a liaison between Page 1 and the SGA Finance Committee, maintains all financial record for Page 1.
- Article V Elections: Elections shall take place prior to March 15 by nominations and a simple majority vote. Quorum is one half of the membership.
- Article VI Meetings: Meetings shall be held once a month to discuss upcoming events and any concerns of the Page 1 Literacy Project. General or informal meetings will be held as appropriate.
- Article VII Committees: The Co-Chairs are granted the power to create and appoint members of committees as is necessary.
- Article VIII Faculty Advisor: The membership recommends a faculty/staff member to advise the organization.
- Article IX Affiliations: The Page 1 Literacy Project will have no direct affiliations with a state, national or international organization.
- Article X Ratification:
- A. The constitution must be ratified by a two-thirds majority of the membership.
 - B. The Student Government Association Constitution Committee must approve the constitution.

Article XI Amendment:

- A. The constitution must be ratified by a two-thirds majority of the membership.
- B. The Student Government Association Constitution Committee must approve the constitution.
