

STEP 1: Language/Culture

- Language competency; you will probably choose to study in a Francophone, Anglophone or Arabic-speaking region. If you already know French, an indigenous African language, or arabic, then you must study a second language.
- A Francophone focus requires that you become as proficient in French as if you were going to France, and that you take an upper-level French course when you return from your study abroad. While abroad, you must take a course of study in an appropriate indigenous African language.
- An Anglophone focus requires that you must make every reasonable effort to learn an indigenous African language: this means that you must study an indigenous language in a summer intensive language program before or after your study abroad. It is expected that you either begin or continue that language study while abroad.
- An Arabic-speaking focus requires that you take at least two years of Arabic before studying abroad, and that you take an upper-level Arabic course when you return, if such a course is offered.

STEP 2: Regional Specialization

- Three courses with exclusive or primarily African content, in at least two different disciplines. No double counting of courses in your disciplinary specialization nor your language.

STEP 3: Study Abroad

- Study abroad in Africa, preferably for a year but at least for one semester. Students must receive the approval of relevant departments and/or, as appropriate, the director of African studies to receive major credit for courses taken abroad.

STEP 4: Senior Program

- Either a senior international studies seminar (INTL 04XX), or students may also propose to write a two-semester honors thesis (INTL 0705) in their senior year. A thesis is required for honors. Students must have a 3.5 average or better in all courses that count for the major to apply to write an honors thesis. No exceptions will be made to these requirements. (1) _____, ((2) _____)
- An upper-level course, preferably two, in the language of emphasis that will be taken after returning from abroad. The language departments will determine which courses can be taken to fulfill this requirement, in consultation with the program director. (1) _____
