

Bobolinks Constitution

Article I: The name of this organization is the Bobolinks.

Article II: The purpose of this organization is to: 1. Provide a coeducational a cappella singing group on the Middlebury campus.

Article III: Membership is open to all students. Auditions will be held to determine the membership.

Article IV: One student will be elected from the membership to serve as the group's leader/musical director. Two students will be elected to serve as business managers; one on-campus business manager and one off-campus business manager. Middlebury College students must hold these positions. The two business managers will be in charge of all funds and will be the liaisons between the SGA and our organization.

Article V: Following the initial elections, officers will be elected in the Fall of each academic year by the members of the group. That member with the majority of votes will win the position for which he/she is running.

Article VI: Meetings/practices will occur on a tri-weekly basis. The meetings will be held to practice, to prepare for concerts and to discuss items of business.

Article VII: There will be no standing committees.

Article VIII: This group agrees to maintain a faculty/staff advisor.

Article IX: We have no affiliations with any local, state, national or international group.

Article X:

This student organization operates in full accordance with Chapter Four, Section II, A of the Middlebury College Handbook concerning Student Organization Policies of Discrimination, Freedom of Association, Anti-Hazing, Freedom of Inquiry and Expression, Student Publication, Funding, Advertising, and Scheduling. Any and all changes

made to the Student Organizations Policies section of the Middlebury College Handbook will immediately become policies adopted by the Bobolinks.

Article XI: Ratification: A. This constitution must be ratified by a two-thirds majority of the membership. B. This constitution must be approved by the Student Government Constitution Committee.

Article X: Amendment: A. Amendments to this constitution must be approved by a two-thirds majority of the membership. B. Amendments to this constitution must be approved by the Student Government Constitution Committee.
