She has been awarded a Ludwig Vogelstein Foundation grant, and is a recent winner of the 1st Place Prize in the *Glimmer Train* Short-Story Award for New Writers. Her fiction has appeared in *Antioch Review*, *Michigan Quarterly Review*, *New Letters*, *Stand Magazine*, and is forthcoming in *Glimmer Train*.

Danica Colic's poems have appeared in *Arts & Letter*, *Fugue*, *Nimrod*, *Pebble Lake Review*, and *Terrain*, among other journals. A graduate of the Hunter College MFA program, she is the author of a chapbook, *Sufficiency*, and curates Uncalled-For Readings, a series that highlights the work of Queer Poets. Raised in Queens, New York, she now lives in Brooklyn, where she manages a restaurant.

Daisy Hernandez is the coeditor of *Colonize This! Young Women of Color on Today's Feminism*. She has written commentaries for NPR's *All Things Considered*, *Christian Science Monitor*, *Ms.*, and the *New York Times*. Her story about the experiences of transgender people of color was nominated for a GLAAD media award in 2009. She's currently at work on a memoir and is entering the MFA program in fiction at the University of Miami.
