

## About the Clinic

Our clinic offers high school players a unique opportunity to train and learn in a collegiate environment, under the guidance of Middlebury coaches, staff, and students. Participants will gain valuable insights into college soccer and high-level Division III athletics, as well as information about Middlebury College, its soccer program, and the college search process in general.

The clinic includes on-field training sessions, a campus tour and college information meeting, a meal in one of the campus dining halls, and the chance to interact with Midd players and coaches. The staff is committed to providing this instruction in a fun, challenging, player-centered learning environment that allows student-athletes the opportunity to both develop and showcase their abilities.

### Middlebury Women's Soccer

The Women's Soccer Program at Middlebury College is a member of the nationally renowned New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC), a unique association of 10 highly selective liberal arts colleges in the Northeast. The conference is widely recognized as the strongest in Division III, and its teams are comprised largely of Division I caliber athletes seeking the special experience these schools have to offer.

Middlebury's program began in 1979, and has since gone on to achieve sustained success at the regional and national level. In 2000, the NESCAC formalized its conference tournament with an automatic NCAA bid for the champion. Since then, Middlebury has reached the conference championship four times, earning bids to the national tournament in 2000, '04, '06, '09, and '11. Our student-athletes excel both in the classroom and on the field, while also making major contributions to both the greater Middlebury and global communities.

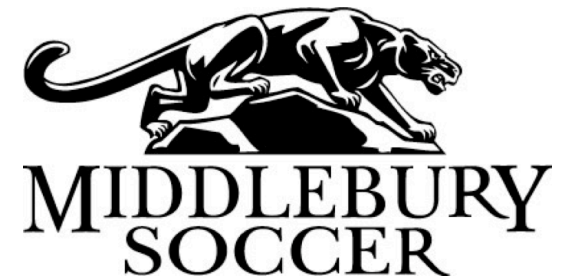
### Coach Peter Kim

Coach Kim became the program's eighth head coach in 2004, and has since become the winningest coach in Midd soccer's history. In his first year, he led the Panthers to an undefeated regular season, ultimately posting a 15-1-3 record as the team progressed deep into the NCAA tournament. During his eight-year tenure, the team has reached the conference final three times, winning in '06, and advancing to the NCAA Round of 16 on four occasions. He has coached numerous All-Conference and All-Region players, including four All-Americans, and been recognized as the NESCAC Coach of the Year three times. Kim holds a USSF "A" License and NSCAA Premier Badge, is a staff coach for USYSA Region I ODP, and serves as the NSCAA Technical Director for the state of Vermont.
