HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

CARL DOUGLAS '88

Doctor of Letters

Carl Douglas '88 is a passionate explorer of the oceans since learning to dive on a dare in 1990, combining his interests in history, photography, and film with diving to tell the stories of the seas. Today he is a fully qualified mixed-gas rebreather diver who leads the exploration efforts of a group of like-minded people. In 1997, he founded Deep Sea Productions, a documentary film company and book publisher based in Stockholm, Sweden. The group has discovered and chronicled more than 300 shipwrecks once considered lost to the deep forever, in addition to covering subjects in current affairs, popular science, and international sports. Among the discoveries in the Baltic Sea are a 17th-century Swedish warship; a Dutch 17th-century merchant vessel; a British WWI submarine; a Swedish Air Force DC-3 spy plane shot down in 1952 by the Soviet Union; as well as dozens of merchant ships, each with an important history of its own. For the discovery of the Swedish DC-3, Douglas was awarded His Majesty the King of Sweden's Medal, 8th Order.

A native of Sweden, Douglas served for 10 years in the Swedish Defense Forces after graduation. Initially serving with the Lappland Rangers in Sweden's Arctic, he also served with the United Nations in Bosnia in 1995. Currently he is a Major in the reserves of the Swedish Amphibious Corps.

Today, Douglas manages the family farm Rydboholm, where he became the 22nd-consecutive generation since 1311 to oversee operations after taking over duties from his mother. He also sits on the boards of directors of several corporations, serving as chairman of MMT AB; vice chairman of Securitas AB and ASSA-ABLOY AB; and as a member of Latour AB.

ANGÉLIQUE KIDJO

Doctor of Arts

Angélique Kidjo is a Grammy Award-winning artist and an unwavering advocate for social justice. Called "Africa's premier diva" by *Time* magazine, Kidjo has crafted a musical repertoire uniquely her own, one that draws upon Afropop, Congolese rumba, jazz, rhythm and blues, gospel, and Latin styles, employed to the delight of audiences worldwide.

A Grammy winner (Best Contemporary World Music Album) for her 2007 work *Djin Djin*, Kidjo recently released her 12th album, titled *Eve*, which is dedicated to "the women of Africa, to their resilience and their beauty." *Eve*'s late-January release was preceded by the publication of Kidjo's memoir *Spirit Rising: My Life, My Music*, which was cowritten by Rachel Wenrick and includes a preface by Desmond Tutu and foreword by Alicia Keys.

As an advocate for social justice, Kidjo has served as a UNICEF Goodwill Ambassador since 2002; has created the Batonga Foundation, which supports education and leadership opportunities for girls in Africa; and has campaigned for clean water, access to medicine, and an African continent free from conflict and war.

A native of Benin, Kidjo speaks and performs in a number of different languages and has taken the stage at venues ranging from Carnegie Hall, the Sydney Opera House, and the Royal Albert Hall in London, to Nobel Peace Prize concerts, Olympic games, and concerts at the UN General Assembly. No stranger to Middlebury, Kidjo delivered an electric performance at the College last fall, an event preceded by a just-as-memorable public conversation serving as the 2013–14 John Hamilton Fulton Lecture in the Liberal Arts.

WILLIAM HENRY KIEFFER III '64

Doctor of Humane Letters

William Henry Kieffer III, Middlebury Class of 1964, was an executive with State Street Corporation, Boston, for 29 years, retiring in August 2002. During his banking career, Kieffer's responsibilities included global lending and cash management and investment management services, the latter focusing on the development and monitoring of investment strategies for worldwide endowments, foundations, and corporate pension plans.

An emeritus trustee at Middlebury since 2009, Kieffer has worked tirelessly for his alma mater for the past half century. He has served as a charter member and vice chair of the board of trustees; as chair of the board of governors for the Monterey Institute of International Studies; as president of the Middlebury Alumni Association; and as co-chair of the Bicentennial Celebration in 2000. He currently serves as co-chair of the Language Schools Centennial Celebration, scheduled for 2015, and will serve on the inaugural board of overseers for the Monterey Institute beginning this summer.

In addition to his service to Middlebury, Kieffer has also chaired, directed, and sat on the boards of a number of other nonprofits, including the Maine Community Foundation, Gould Academy, Trinity Boston Foundation, and the Oxford County Advisory Fund.

Prior to his banking career, Kieffer was an officer in the United States Navy, serving on a destroyer in the Pacific Fleet. During his three-year tour, Kieffer spent 13 months off the coast of Vietnam, where the USS *Porterfield* supported flight operations, marine landings, and other missions.

RICHARD C. LEVIN

Doctor of Letters

Richard C. Levin recently completed a 20-year term as president of Yale University, a tenure noted for its longevity—one of the longest in the university's history—and for the high degree of achievement by its officeholder. Levin's accomplishments earned him worldwide respect as a transformational leader in higher education upon his retirement from the office last year.

Under Levin's direction, Yale became a true international university, launching the Yale Center for the Study of Globalization; opening the first liberal arts college in Asia in collaboration with the National University of Singapore; creating the Yale World Fellows Program, which trains a worldwide network of emerging leaders; and introducing a financial aid policy to provide international students with the same generous financial aid awarded to U.S. students.

As president, Levin oversaw a successful \$3.88 billion fundraising campaign; strengthened Yale's programs in science, engineering, and medicine; vastly expanded and improved upon the university's campus and facilities, the largest undertaking at Yale in nearly a century; and advanced economic development and home ownership in the city of New Haven.

A distinguished economist and Yale faculty member since 1974, Levin had previously served as the Frederick William Beinecke Professor of Economics, chaired the economics department, and served as dean of Yale's Graduate School of Arts and Sciences. In April of this year, Levin was named chief executive officer of Coursera, a platform for the provision of open online courses offered by more than one hundred universities worldwide. He also serves on President Obama's Council of Advisors for Science and Technology and is a fellow of the American Academy of Sciences and the American Philosophical Society.

REUBEN MARK '60

Doctor of Laws

Reuben Mark, Middlebury Class of 1960, is the retired chairman and CEO of Colgate-Palmolive, where he worked for more than 45 years. With a two-and-a-half-decade tenure as chief executive, Reuben was the longest-serving leader in Colgate's history as a public company. His leadership has been commended and celebrated for its intense focus on company culture and incremental business improvement, a strategy that led to extraordinary growth and global expansion—and a steady transformation of Colgate-Palmolive into one of the world's leading household consumer products companies. During Reuben's time as CEO, Colgate-Palmolive recorded a total return of 4,200 percent, which was 40 percent higher than the nearest competitor.

An economics theory major at Middlebury, Reuben has spoken eloquently on the liberal arts contribution to business leadership. He served as a Middlebury trustee from 1985–1994, and has been a staunch supporter of faculty scholarship, teaching, and development. His son, Peter, graduated from Middlebury in 1988.

During his career, Reuben's corporate affiliations have extended beyond Colgate-Palmolive, as he served as a director of the New York Stock Exchange, Citigroup, Time Warner, and Pearson's PLC. He is currently a director of Cabela's Inc. and chairman emeritus of Catalyst Inc., a nonprofit organization that promotes inclusive workplaces for women.

Reuben and Arlene, his wife of 50 years and an author and school psychologist, have been deeply involved in inner-city education for many years.

DIANA NYAD

Doctor of Humane Letters

World-renowned athlete Diana Nyad is the first person to swim from Havana, Cuba, to Key West, Florida, a 110-mile journey, without the aid of a shark cage. Last year, she finally achieved the feat on her fifth attempt at the age of 64.

A member of the International Swimming Hall of Fame and the International Women's Sports Hall of Fame, Nyad set open-water records for speed (swimming around the island of Manhattan in under eight hours in 1975) and distance (swimming the 102.5 miles from the Bahamas to Florida in 1979). She retired from competitive swimming at the age of 30 to focus on writing and broadcasting.

During her hiatus, she wrote three books and was a regular sports contributor for ABC (*Wide World of Sports*), CBS (*Sunday Morning*), CNBC (*One on One with Diana Nyad*), American Public Media (*Marketplace*, *The Savvy Traveler*), and NPR (*All Things Considered*). She returned to the water after turning 60, determined to complete the swim that bedeviled her once in 1978 and eluded all who have attempted.

Between 2011 and 2013, Nyad unsuccessfully attempted the Cuba-Florida swim three more times, before succeeding on her fifth and final try. Since completing the heroic feat, Nyad has traveled the country inspiring audiences, raised over \$100,000 for Hurricane Sandy relief, and begun penning her memoir.

Be it now known to you that the President of the College, with the approval of our honored and esteemed Fellows, has dignified and graced _____ with the title and rank of Bachelor of Liberal Arts, and has conferred on her/him all the privileges and honors pertaining thereto. Let the official seal of the College and the signature of the President bear witness to this act.

Issued at the College on the 25th of May, in the year of the Lord 2014, and in the 238th year of the American Republic.

THE SEAL

The official seal of Middlebury College shows an open book, with simple marks for letters. The College's motto, *Scientia et Virtus* (Knowledge and Virtue), is written on either side of the book. Around the edge of the seal are four abbreviated Latin words: *Coll. Med. Virid. Mon.* Their full form is *Collegium Medioburiense Viridis Montis*; in English, Middlebury College of Vermont.

GAMALIEL PAINTER'S CANE

Gamaliel Painter's cane is one of the most treasured artifacts of the College. Once the walking stick of the founder of both the Town and the College, today it is carried by the president in the academic procession. It serves as the College's mace and as a symbol of institutional strength and character. The president will present to members of the Class of 2014 a replica of the original cane, reminding the graduates that they go forward from Middlebury with the strength and character of the College always at their side.

Students carrying a cane in the academic procession are those who completed their degree requirements in December 2013 or January 2014 and received their canes at the February celebration earlier this year.

THE MEDALLION

The medallion was first presented to Samuel S. Stratton by the Board of Trustees upon his inauguration as the 11th president of Middlebury College in 1943. A new medallion bearing the names of all 16 College presidents was presented by John and Bonnie McCardell to President Ronald D. Liebowitz at his inauguration as the 16th president in 2004. The medallion is passed on from president to president as a symbol of office and is worn on all ceremonial occasions.

ACADEMIC COSTUME

The academic costume, which originated at Oxford and Cambridge Universities in England in the 1300s, has been in use in the United States since colonial days, although not until the 1890s was there a decided movement toward greater use of the academic costume by senior classes, trustees, and faculties. In 1895, representatives of American schools codified standards for academic dress with the establishment of the Intercollegiate Dress Code.

THE GOWN

The flowing gown comes from the 12th century. While it originally may have been worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings, today it has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it covers any dress of rank or social standing. Traditionally it is black for all degrees.

The bachelor's gown is relatively simple, with long, pleated front panels, and intricate shirring across the shoulders and back. The gown is worn closed and is distinguished by its long, pointed sleeves.

The master's gown has the same yoke effect but is designed to be worn open. It has a very long sleeve, oblong in shape with an arc cut out of the bottom of the front. The oblong is closed at the base and the forearm protrudes through a notched slit at the elbow.

Gowns for the doctor's degree are also designed to be worn open, but carry five-inch-wide velvet panels, which extend all the way to the bottom of the garment. Three horizontal velvet bars are stitched on the upper arm of the full, round, bell-shaped sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the faculty to which the degree refers.

In recent years a number of universities have adopted alternative robes using their traditional school colors, such as crimson for Harvard, blue for Yale, slate gray for Columbia, maroon for Chicago, and cardinal red for Stanford.

THE CAP

When Roman law freed the slave, he won the privilege of wearing a cap. The academic cap is a sign of freedom of scholarship and the responsibility and dignity with which scholarship endows the wearer. Old poetry records the cap of scholarship as square to symbolize the book. The cap worn almost universally in academic processions is the Oxford cap, better known as the mortarboard.

The tassel may either be black or reflect the scholarly subject, although only doctor's degree recipients may have gold thread. A different style cap, the Cambridge cap, resembles a large beret.

THE HOOD

The hood is the most distinguishing feature of all academic costumes. Originally, it seems to have had three uses: as a hood covering; as a shoulder cape; or, when hung from the shoulder, as a bag in which alms could be collected.

The size and shape of the American hood mark the college degree of the wearer. The hood's outside is bordered with velvet of the proper width to indicate the degree and the proper color to indicate the department or field of study. Thus, a degree conferred as Bachelor of Arts requires the white of arts, letters, and humanities, whereas the Bachelor of Science degree requires the yellow of science.

The shapes of the bachelor's hood and the master's hood are similar, the former being three feet in overall length and the latter three and one-half feet. The doctor's hood has a base that is rounder and has an overall length of four feet. The respective widths of the velvet borders are two inches for the bachelor's, three inches for the master's, and five inches for the doctor's hood. The covered lining on the inside of the hood is the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. Where there is more than one color, the second color is usually represented by a chevron, a wide stripe across the background color, or field. Thus, the inside of the Middlebury hood has a blue background with a white chevron.

Members of the governing board of the degree-conferring institution normally wear the doctor's gown, but their hoods represent only such degrees as are actually held.
