Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs)

AEDs are emergency medical devices used when a person is experiencing cardiac arrest, delivering an electrical shock designed to return the heart to its normal rhythm. Middlebury College maintains a number of these devices in fixed locations, as well as portable units in the Public Safety vehicles and with the Sports Medicine staff.
