Notes:

1. The fall enrollment census is taken each year at the end of the add-drop period and no later than October 15th by requirement of the federal government.
2. By federal definitions, these figures *do not* include Middlebury students who are away from campus, studying away/abroad in either Middlebury (N=95) or non-Middlebury (N=90) programs.
3. These data do not include students enrolled in the Language Schools, Bread Loaf School of English, or the Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey.
4. By federal definition, a part-time student counts as a third of an FTE. FTE calculation: FT + (PT/3) = FTE the 2,542 students on campus this fall, approximately 23% are domestic students of color. The following table shows the racial/ethnic composition of the on-campus student body.

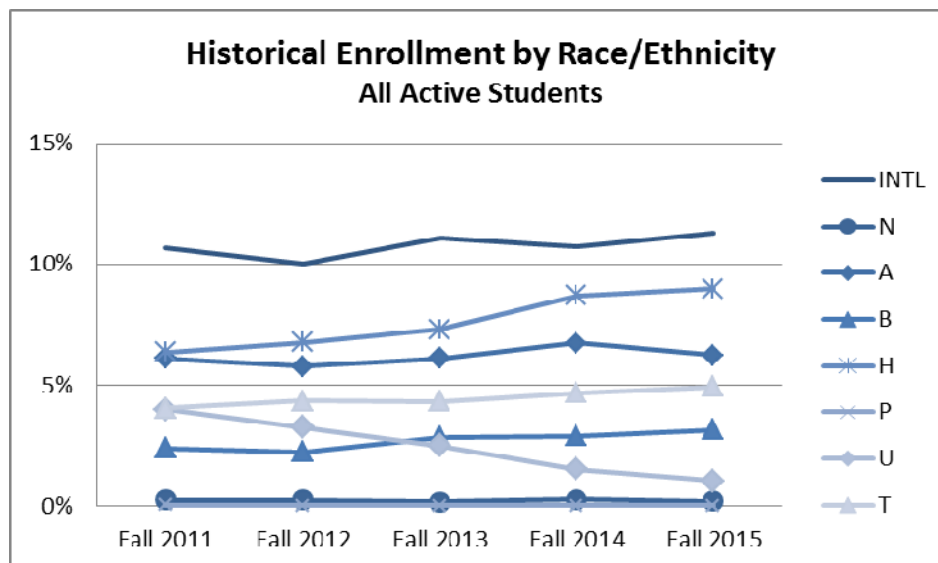
