Notes:

1. The fall enrollment census is taken each year at the end of the add-drop period and no later than October 17th by requirement of the federal government.
2. By federal definitions, these figures do not include Middlebury students who are away from campus, studying away/abroad in either Middlebury (N=135) or non-Middlebury (N=113) programs.
3. These figures do not include students enrolled in the Language Schools, Bread Loaf School of English, or the Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey.
4. By federal definition, a part-time student counts as a third of an FTE. FTE calculation: FT + (PT/3) = 2,560 students on campus this fall.
