Special Screening: Reality Frictions with Steve Anderson

On the final Tuesday of October, Professor Jason Mittell hosted an engaging screening of Reality Frictions, a new feature-length video essay by filmmaker and scholar Steve Anderson from UCLA. Reality Frictions dives deep into the intersections of fact and fiction on Hollywood screens, spotlighting those moments when real-world images, people, or events intrude upon cinematic narratives. In a time of generative AI and synthetic imaging—when distinguishing real from fake grows increasingly challenging—Reality Frictions offers a compelling exploration of how audiences have long developed sophisticated ways to navigate the blend of reality and illusion in media. Richly illustrated with clips from over 100 films and shows, this video essay is both an entertaining and thoughtprovoking investigation into media's role in shaping truth and history.

Guest Speaker Spotlight: David Bloch


This month, our Media Curation and Exhibition students had the incredible opportunity to engage with Middlebury alum David Bloch '86, a film marketing expert whose clients include Netflix, Amazon, A24, and Universal. David did campaigns for Brokeback Mountain and Chicago among others.

In class, David shared his expertise on acclaimed writer-director Jacques Audiard, using this quote from NY Times to describe his work:

"Audiard's entire oeuvre can be seen as a means of imaginatively aligning himself, as well as the viewer, with the outsider". Besides focusing on The Outsider as a key theme in Audiard's films, David provided analysis of his movies as great examples of films where fantasy meets social realism.

"On one level, it's entertaining; on another, it's artistically and socially relevant. It satisfies many different tastes by operating on multiple planes", says David about *Dheepan*.

David's insights set the perfect stage for our next Hirschfield Screening of *Emilia Pérez*, as we dive deeper into Audiard's creative world with our upcoming event.
