HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

KIM STANLEY ROBINSON

Doctor of Humane Letters

Kim Stanley Robinson is an American science fiction writer. He is the author of 20 novels, including the international best-selling *Mars Trilogy*. His most recent books are *The Ministry for the Future* and *The High Sierra: A Love Story*. He was sent by the U.S. National Science Foundation to Antarctica in 1995 and 2016, and his next book, about Antarctica, will be called *The Best Journey in the World*. He was a featured speaker at COP-26 in Glasgow, at the UN's Summit of the Future in 2024, and at COP-30 in Belém, Brazil. His work has been translated into 30 languages. In 2016, asteroid 72432 was named "Kimrobinson." He lives in Davis, California.

SHABANA BASIJ-RASIKH

Doctor of Humanities

Shabana Basij-Rasikh '11 is the cofounder and president of the School of Leadership, Afghanistan (SOLA). SOLA is the first and only boarding school for Afghan girls, and it operated in Kabul from 2016 through 2021, until the Taliban returned to power. In August 2021, Shabana led the evacuation of her entire school community from Afghanistan to Rwanda, where SOLA reestablished its operations and its students resumed their studies. She has overseen SOLA's successful growth in Rwanda; in 2025, the school received 5,416 applications from Afghan girls worldwide for approximately 30 spots on campus. Shabana also oversaw SOLA's expansion into the digital realm with 2024's launch of SOLAx, a WhatsApp-based online academy with more than 26,000 learners. She is a 2011 magna cum laude graduate of Middlebury College and holds a Master of Public Policy from Oxford University. In 2018, she was awarded the Malalai Medal, one of Afghanistan's highest national honors, for her work in promoting girls' access to education. In 2023, the National Geographic Society named her the Rolex National Geographic Explorer of the Year in recognition of her important work in education.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

ANDREA E. GREEN

Doctor of Humane Letters

Andrea E. Green, MDCM, FAAP is a professor of pediatrics at the University of Vermont Larner College of Medicine. She is the director of the Pediatric New American Program and pediatric global health at the Golisano Children's Hospital at UVM. Her clinical duties and scholarship are in providing care to children in immigrant families (CIF). Her areas of academic focus regarding CIF include mental health and multigenerational trauma; nonmedical drivers of health including food insecurity and nontraditional U.S. diets; health literacy; community and medical care coordination; and autism. She has authored peer-reviewed primary research, commentary, and policy and has spoken regionally and nationally on pediatric immigrant health care. A past chair of the American Academy of Pediatrics Council on Community Pediatrics, she is actively engaged in advocacy work to support Vermont's immigrant population.

ANGELO LYNN

Doctor of Humane Letters

Angelo Lynn has been the owner, editor, and publisher of the *Addison County Independent* in Middlebury, Vermont, since 1984. The paper, which he runs with his three daughters, has been consistently recognized for its quality; among many other honors, it has won the New England Newspaper and Press Association's General Excellence Award eight times. Angelo has also won NENPA Awards for his editorials and political columns. He is a Hall of Fame member of both the Addison County Chamber of Commerce and the New England Newspaper and Press Association. In 2019 he received New England's highest journalism honor, the Yankee Quill Award, and in 2022, he won Middlebury College's Bonnie and John McCardell Citizen's Award. Addison Press, the *Independent's* parent publishing company, has been named the Addison County Chamber of Commerce Business of the Year and won the United Way of Addison County's Outstanding Business Award. Angelo supports several local arts organizations, including Town Hall Theater and the Middlebury New Filmmakers Festival, and has served on numerous nonprofit boards. He sits on the Academy of New England Journalists and is president of Addison Independent Trust, Ltd., a recently founded nonprofit to help sustain local journalism in Addison County.

Be it now known to you that the President of the College, with the approval of our honored and esteemed Fellows, has dignified and graced _____ with the title and rank of Bachelor of Liberal Arts, and has conferred on her/him all the privileges and honors pertaining thereto. Let the official seal of the College and the signature of the President bear witness to this act.

Issued at the College on the 24th of May, in the year of the Lord 2026, and in the 250th year of the American Republic.

THE SEAL

The official seal of Middlebury College shows an open book, with simple marks for letters. The College's motto, *Scientia et Virtus* (Knowledge and Virtue), is written on either side of the book. Around the edge of the seal are four abbreviated Latin words: *Coll. Med. Virid. Mon.* Their full form is *Collegium Medioburiense Viridis Montis*; in English, Middlebury College of Vermont.

GAMALIEL PAINTER'S CANE

Gamaliel Painter's cane is one of the most treasured artifacts of the College. Once the walking stick of the founder of both the Town and the College, today it is carried by the president in the academic procession. It serves as the College's mace and as a symbol of institutional strength and character. The president will present to members of the Class of 2026 a replica of the original cane, reminding the graduates that they go forward from Middlebury with the strength and character of the College always at their side.

THE MEDALLION

The presidential medallion, which is worn on all ceremonial occasions, carries the official seal of Middlebury College on the obverse and the name of the current president and date of inauguration on the reverse. The first presidential medallion was presented to Samuel S. Stratton by the Board of Trustees upon his inauguration as the 11th president of Middlebury College in 1943.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The academic regalia, which originated at Oxford and Cambridge Universities in England in the 1300s, has been in use in the United States since colonial days, although not until the 1890s was there a decided movement toward greater use of the academic regalia by senior classes, trustees, and faculties. In 1895, representatives of American schools codified standards for academic dress with the establishment of the Intercollegiate Dress Code.

THE GOWN

The flowing gown comes from the 12th century. While it originally may have been worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings, today it has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it covers any dress of rank or social standing. Traditionally it is black for all degrees.

The bachelor's gown is relatively simple, with long, pleated front panels, and intricate shirring across the shoulders and back. The gown is worn closed and is distinguished by its long, pointed sleeves.

The master's gown has the same yoke effect but is designed to be worn open. It has a very long sleeve, oblong in shape with an arc cut out of the bottom of the front. The oblong is closed at the base and the forearm protrudes through a notched slit at the elbow.

Gowns for the doctor's degree are also designed to be worn open, but carry five-inch-wide velvet panels, which extend all the way to the bottom of the garment. Three horizontal velvet bars are stitched on the upper arm of the full, round, bell-shaped sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the faculty to which the degree refers.

In recent years a number of universities have adopted alternative robes using their traditional school colors, such as crimson for Harvard, blue for Yale, slate gray for Columbia, maroon for Chicago, and cardinal red for Stanford.

THE CAP

When the slave was freed by Roman law, he won the privilege of wearing a cap. The academic cap is a sign of freedom of scholarship and the responsibility and dignity with which scholarship endows the wearer. Old poetry records the cap of scholarship as square to symbolize the book. The cap worn almost universally in academic processions is the Oxford cap, better known

as the mortarboard. The tassel may either be black or reflect the scholarly subject, although only doctor's degree recipients may have gold thread. A different style cap, the Cambridge cap, resembles a large beret.

THE HOOD

The hood is the most distinguishing feature of all academic costumes. Originally, it seems to have had three uses: as a hood covering; as a shoulder cape; or, when hung from the shoulder, as a bag in which alms could be collected.

The size and shape of the American hood mark the college degree of the wearer. The hood's outside is bordered with velvet of the proper width to indicate the degree and the proper color to indicate the department or field of study. Thus, a degree conferred as Bachelor of Arts requires the white of arts, letters, and humanities, whereas the Bachelor of Science degree requires the yellow of science.

The shapes of the bachelor's hood and the master's hood are similar, the former being three feet in overall length and the latter three and one-half feet. The doctor's hood has a base that is rounder and has an overall length of four feet. The respective widths of the velvet borders are two inches for the bachelor's, three inches for the master's, and five inches for the doctor's hood. The covered lining on the inside of the hood is the official color or colors of the institution conferring the degree. Where there is more than one color, the second color is usually represented by a chevron, a wide stripe across the background color, or field. Thus, the inside of the Middlebury hood has a blue background with a white chevron.

Members of the governing board of the degree-conferring institution normally wear the doctor's gown, but their hoods represent only such degrees as are actually held.
