



## APPLYING TO MIDDLEBURY

Admission to Middlebury is competitive. Most admitted students rank in the top 10 percent of their high school classes. We look for students who challenge themselves with rigorous course loads and a commitment to nonacademic interests.

Interviews are not required, although they are offered with alumni volunteers when possible.

### MIDDLEBURY'S FINANCIAL AID COMMITMENT

Your financial need is not part of our admission decision process. We're a "need-blind" institution. This means, if you're a U.S. student, we won't consider your financial aid application in our admissions review.

If you're admitted to Middlebury, we will meet 100 percent of your full calculated financial need. We determine your need using information about your family's income and assets that you provide when you apply for financial aid. You apply for aid with both the CSS and FAFSA at the same time you apply for admission.

Almost all our financial aid is institutional grants and scholarships. Grants and scholarship aid do not have to be paid back. You may also have a work component and a small amount of loans in your financial aid package; your loan amount will be limited based on your family's income.

All of Middlebury's financial aid is need based. We don't offer merit aid, including academic or athletic scholarships.

Middlebury is a QuestBridge and Posse partner. All QuestBridge students and Posse scholars receive full scholarships.
