The TLM program is designated as a STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) degree, which expands career opportunities for international students and scholarship opportunities for U.S. students.

Launch a flexible career with advanced language and technical skills. Earn two master's degrees in three years by combining TLM with a master's in translation, translation and interpretation, or conference interpretation.

Accelerated and Advanced Entry

Applicants with relevant work experience may be able to complete the degree in two or three semesters.
