Professor Anna Vassilieva has taught at MIIS for almost thirty years, twenty of which she served as the Russian Studies program head. Professor Vassilieva teaches courses dealing with Russian intellectual discourse, Siberia and the Russian Pacific, and contemporary Russian politics. Central to all of her classes is a focus on the manner in which language, literature, culture, and history impact current Russian policies and perspectives. With faculty colleagues, she pioneered the development and implementation of Monterey Model courses—teaching modules taught simultaneously in a variety of languages to advanced language speakers on a wide range of current topics.
