

### Complete your bachelor's—plus a careeroriented master's degree.

In just three years, you can earn a Bachelor of Arts in international policy and Master of Arts in one of three areas from the Middlebury Institute. Students transfer in 60 credits from an accredited college or university and complete a 90-credit, six-semester joint degree at the Institute. Ideal candidates have already accumulated two years of undergraduate course work and have civilian or military work experience.
