Energy

Energy Bill Payment Support

As students, one of the major concerns we have is maintaining our finances. Energy bills, in particular, can be quite expensive depending on the time of year. Here are a couple of resources we have found that can help alleviate this financial burden (which we often qualify for as students with low income).

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

PG&E offers financial assistance to California residents through LIHEAP. If eligible, this program provides:

A one-time payment of your residential utility bill Emergency assistance during a residential energy-related crisis Support for home weatherization

California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE)

Food Stamps

Another great option students have for living healthier and saving money is to sign up for Food Stamps through CalFresh, which all students on federal work-study are eligible for.
