Since its founding in 1915, Middlebury Language Schools has been one of the nation's preeminent summer language learning and graduate programs.

Why Middlebury?

FLEXIBLE OPTIONS: Complete your graduate degree over four six-week summers in Vermont, or over one or two six-week summers and an academic year at a Middlebury School Abroad or online.

FUNDING: Generous financial aid is available. Up to 100 percent financial aid (includes tuition, housing, and food) is possible for students enrolled in the four-summer option.

LANGUAGE PLEDGE®: Formally commit to communicating only in your language of study for your entire time in the program for 24/7 full immersion.

NETWORK: Be part of a community of like-minded learners, gifted and world-renowned faculty, and a supportive alumni network.

GRADUATE OPTIONS

MASTER OF ARTS (MA)

The MA has the flexibility for careers in academia, government, business, or the nonprofit sector. Choose from many degree specializations.

Formats: Option 1—Four six-week summers at the Language Schools in Vermont. Option 2—One or two six-week summers combined with an academic year abroad or online.

MASTER OF ARTS IN APPLIED LANGUAGES (MA)

The MA in Applied Languages is a one-year program for students who want to acquire knowledge and experience in such areas as migration, development, cultural heritage, and tourism studies.

Format: One six-week summer at the Language Schools in Vermont and an academic year abroad, including an international internship.

MASTER OF ARTS IN TEACHING (MAT) WITH LICENSURE

The MA in Teaching offers a secondary (7-12) teaching license in modern languages valid for teaching in U.S. public school systems.

Format: One six-week summer at the Language Schools in Vermont and an academic year online (asynchronous) followed by a six-week summer at the Language Schools in Vermont and a fall teaching practicum in your preferred place of residence.

DOCTOR OF MODERN LANGUAGES (DML)

The DML is unique to Middlebury and prepares teacher-scholars in two modern foreign languages.

ADDITIONAL OPTIONS

NONDEGREE GRADUATE OPTION

The nondegree graduate option is for students with graduate-level proficiency who want to attend our graduate programs for just one sixweek summer. (9 graduate credits)

Format: One six-week summer at the Language Schools in Vermont.

SUMMER IMMERSION PROGRAMS

The seven- and eight-week programs (9 or 12 college credits) in Vermont are designed for beginning to advanced language learners. High school graduates to ages 80+ are eligible.

FLEXIBLE AND AFFORDABLE

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

Students must submit their applications for admission before applying for merit scholarships or financial aid. Most merit scholarship application deadlines are December 15.

Middlebury need-based financial aid is in the form of grants, rather than loans. Middlebury may meet up to 100 percent (tuition, housing, and food) of demonstrated financial

need for MA students choosing to study over four summers. Students who choose to study over the academic year will be eligible for partial financial aid on a first-come, first-served basis.

A GLOBAL DEGREE

Depending on your language, you have two options for completing your MA: Four summers in Vermont (with options in Argentina and France) or one or two summers in Vermont and an academic year abroad (France, Germany, Italy, Kazakhstan, or Spain) or online.

Eligibility:

Students must have a bachelor's degree or equivalent and graduate level proficiency in their language of study.

Requirements:

- Official transcript(s)
- Three recommendation forms
- \$75 application fee
- Language proficiency exam and/ or writing sample
- Additional requirements (vary depending on language)
