

COVID-19 Hazard Analysis and PPE Assessment Updated January 7, 2022 by Middlebury Environmental Health and Safety Office

This document provides a hazard analysis and PPE assessment for **employees who may have exposure to individuals with suspected or confirmed COVID-19**.

- When respiratory protection (N95 or PAPR) is **required**, employees must be enrolled in Middlebury's Respiratory Protection Program per OSHA 29 CFR 1910.134.
- When respiratory protection use is **voluntary**, employees must be provided training on voluntary use of N95 respirators.
- For other employees, general information about COVID-19 safety is found in the <u>Working on Campus portion</u> of <u>Middlebury's Campus Guide</u>.

¹For aerosol generating procedures (AGPs) performed on a person with suspected or confirmed COVID-19, OSHA encourages employers to select elastomeric respirators or PAPRs instead of filtering facepiece respirators.

²OSHA defines "exposure" as "close proximity, which includes being within 6 feet of or in the same room as a person with suspected or confirmed COVID-19". Staff performing brief tasks that do not include any exposure to COVID-19 positive students, such as delivery of meals or other items to students who are isolating, would not be required to wear respiratory PPE.
