## ARRIVAL AND CHECK-IN

Check-in for your class will begin at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 5. You may go directly to your class headquarters in Hepburn (1970) or Gifford (1971). The first step at check-in is to show proof of vaccination (including booster). You will then receive a bracelet that signifies that you have met all vaccination/booster criteria. There you will get your name tag (which serves as your meal ticket), an up-to-date schedule of events, a 50th gold ribbon for your cane, your room key if you are staying on campus, a Reunion souvenir, and any additional class or event information.

Whether or not you are staying on campus, you must check in at your class headquarters to get your registration packet and name tag. Please remember that there is no walk-in registration this year.

We encourage you to arrive as close as possible to check-in on Sunday to allow yourself time to get settled in and attend events in the afternoon with your class.

## **CLASS HOUSING AND HEADQUARTERS**

Celebration Classes of 1970 and 1971 will be housed in Hepburn and Gifford Halls, and your headquarters will be in the Hepburn Lounge and Gifford 156. Most rooms are doubles, but you will only be assigned a roommate if you signed up with a partner. Bathrooms are shared. A pillow, sheets, a blanket, and a towel are provided. It may be helpful to bring things like an extra blanket, reading lamp, or small fan with you. Both Hepburn and Gifford **do** have elevators for getting to the upper floors.

#### **PARKING**

When you arrive on campus, please park only in designated faculty, staff, or visitor parking spaces. Since you will be the only two classes in attendance this weekend, parking should be easier. Lot M behind Proctor (Hillcrest Road) and along the tennis courts are for those who arrive early. If they are full, it's best to park in the lot down College Street (Route 125) across from Bicentennial Way and the solar panels, behind Homer Harris House (Lot R). A few ADA-accessible spaces are also available for those with appropriate plates or permits. A parking pass for your car is included with this mailing; please complete it and place it on your dashboard when you park. If you forget to bring this pass, extras will be available at your headquarters.

During drop-off times, you may unload your suitcases in front of Hepburn or Gifford, but **you may not leave your car there or in any designated "No Parking" area for an extended period.**There is no long-term parking along Hepburn Road. During check-in, you will be directed to designated parking areas (Lots M and R), and shuttles will be available to bring you back to your dorms.

#### ON-CAMPUS TRANSPORTATION

Middlebury's beautiful campus can be a bit challenging to navigate. We will have dedicated vans and golf carts available for those who need assistance—if needed, please request transportation at your headquarters.

#### DINING

Meals will be provided from Sunday lunch through Tuesday breakfast. **Please wear your name tag to all meals.** Churchill '71 and Janet Halstead Franklin '72 have graciously offered their home for a brunch\* following checkout on Tuesday, starting at 9:00 a.m. A big thanks to them!
