REGISTRATION AND PRICING

Online registration opens March 15. Register at go.middlebury.edu/ reunionregistration as we are not sending a hard-copy registration form this year. If you are experiencing any trouble accessing and completing the online form, you can get assistance by calling 802-443-5183.

Please register as early as possible so that we can best predict housing and event space needs. Online registration closes on **May 21**.

FULL WEEKEND PACKAGES (per person)

Full weekend with housing: \$325

Full weekend without housing: \$200

Full-weekend packages include all meals, entertainment, lectures and panels, activities, and on-campus transportation. Friday and Saturday dinners include an open bar (beer and wine only). SINGLE DAY PACKAGES (per person)

Single day with housing: \$200 (includes breakfast the following morning)

Single day without housing: \$110 *(includes breakfast, lunch, and dinner)*

Note: The price of the single-day package covers meals, entertainment, lectures and panels, activities, and on-campus transportation.

Walk-ins will be accepted for daily events. Unfortunately, we cannot provide housing for walk-ins. Walk-in registration is at Forest Hall Lounge headquarters.

The Class of 1973 and their guests will be housed in Forest Hall in single rooms with a shared sink and a hallway bathroom. Sheets, a pillow, a blanket, and bath towels will be provided for each guest.

DINING

Reunion package options include meals throughout the weekend, from Thursday lunch to Sunday breakfast. Thursday afternoon, President Laurie Patton is hosting a reception, followed by dinner at Ross Dining Hall for the Class of 1973. Breakfasts and lunches are served at Proctor and Ross Dining Halls. Friday's dinner and entertainment are held under the tent behind Mahaney Arts Center. On Saturday, all Reunion classes gather for a festive reception and dinner under the Mahaney tents, followed by a fireworks display, live music, and dancing.

ARRIVING AND CHECKING IN

Check-in for the 50th Reunion begins at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 8, at your class headquarters in Forest Hall. Plan to arrive when check-in begins to pick up your registration packet, be greeted by your class volunteers, and get started on the morning's activities. At check-in you will receive your name tag, which also serves as your meal pass; a current schedule of events; your room code (if you are staying on campus); your class souvenir; and other important class and event information. If you are not staying on campus, you still must check in at Forest Hall.



WEEKEND PARKING

The Class of 1973 has a reserved parking area up the hill from Forest Hall, in Lot M behind Proctor Dining Hall on Hillcrest Road, as well as in Lot R behind the Homer Harris House on Route 125. **Parking in front of Forest Hall is for drop-off only.** Students and staff will be available to help you with your luggage, and golf carts will make loops to provide rides from parking lots for those who need mobility assistance.

ON-CAMPUS TRANSPORTATION

Assistance is available to navigate the hills around campus and get to the various venues. On Friday and Saturday of Reunion Weekend, we'll have shuttles available, as well as golf carts and vans for those who need assistance at other times. The 50th Reunion class will be staying in Forest Hall, which is equipped with elevators.
