Taverns, Transport, and Tourism

Tuck in to a feast for the body and mind, Oxford-style!

Chiang Mai Kitchen- Sit-down, upscale Thai restaurant, with lunch, dinner, and vegan menus.

<u>The Bear</u>- A small inn and pub tracing back to 1241 (the "oldest pub in Oxford!). Featuring refined pub classics, a variety of menus, and heated outdoor seating.

Handlebar Café- Bike shop-themed café with a terrace and cozy décor. Breakfast, brunch, lunch, and coffee.

Lamb & Flag- 455 Year Old pub where J.R.R. Tolkein, C.S. Lewis, and Thomas Hardy drank!

LEON Oxford- Mediterranean "healthy" fast food with counter service and take-out.

Missing Bean Turl Street - Espresso bar also offering pastries and ciabatta sandwiches.

The Perch- "Proper British pub food" in a 17th century historic pub and restaurant.

Pieminster- Casual restaurant serving locally-made savory pies; gluten-free and vegan options.

<u>Turf Tavern-</u> A charming pub right at the heart of Oxford University. Medieval, winding, interconnected rooms and beer garden.

<u>Vaults & Garden</u>- An ecologically-minded café serving organic, locally-sourced breakfast, lunch, tea, and coffee – with a front-row view of Radcliffe Camera.

<u>Wagamama Oxford</u>- Famous British chain of Asian-inspired restaurants featuring communal dining and noodle bowls.

<u>Wasabi</u>- Chain Japanese restaurant serving bento boxes and sushi, with dine-in or out options. 11-12 Cornmarket St.

Nightlife

The Jolly Farmers- Oxford's oldest LGBTQ+ bar and venue.

The House- A young person's bar with games room and happy hour.

Varsity Club- A rooftop bar, club, and cocktail lounge with 360 degree views of Oxford spires.

Transport

<u>Airline Coach Service</u>- Bus service to/from Heathrow and Gatwick airports. For London Stansted airport, take the <u>Stansted express</u> train to London Liverpool St., then the Tube to Paddington or Marylebone to catch the train to Oxford.

Bikes are a popular form of transportation in Oxford, with many streets closed to motor vehicles.

Brompton Bike Hire- A national network of self-serve folding bikes stored in lockers. Near the train station.

Donkey Republic- Bike rental via app.

Pony Bikes and Electric Scooters- Find and unlock via app.

Oxford Bus Company- Website with a full listing of local maps, routes, and fairs.

Oxford Tube- Coach (bus) that runs between Oxford and London.

<u>Taxis-</u> This webpage covers different options for hiring a cab in Oxford.

Train- Several different rail companies serve Oxford. Search using the <u>National Rail Enquiries</u> website.

Tourism

Museums

<u>Ashmolean</u>- The University of Oxford's museum of art and archaeology. Free admission.

<u>Museum of Oxford</u>- A museum dedicated to telling the story of Oxford and its people. Free admission for individuals.

<u>History of Science Museum</u>- Right around the corner from the Bodleian Library, the History of Science museum is described as a "meeting point for people, science, art and belief." Free admission.

Oxford Castle & Prison- Historical site tracing back to William the Conqueror. Climb St. George's tower, descend into the 900-year-old crypt, and explore 18th century prison cells. Student admission £16.50.

Oxford University Museum of Natural History - Houses a stunning collection of natural history specimens and offers teaching, research, and events focused on the natural world. Free admission.

<u>Pitt Rivers Museum</u>- A unique University of Oxford museum featuring colonial and world history objects arranged by type into a "democracy of things." Free admission

<u>The Story Museum</u>- Ostensibly a children's museum, but certainly of interest to students of literature, The Story Museum celebrates the human need for stories through magical, interactive exhibits.

<u>University of Oxford Botanic Garden & Arboretum</u>- The UK's oldest botanic garden, with plants from around the world and an arboretum housing English plants as well as rare and endangered trees from around the world.

<u>University of Oxford Colleges</u>- Each is unique and replete with historical significance and charm. Explore beyond Lincoln College on your own or join a guided tour. Your Bodleian Library card can earn you free admission to many of these colleges.

Exercise

Buzz Gym- Open 24 hours, no contract, £22.99/month for students.

Oxford University Sport/ Iffley Road Sports Centre- Oxford University sports center. Bread Loaf students need to purchase a "concessions" level membership.

PureGym- No-contract gym for £18.99/month.

Outdoors

<u>Hinksey Park</u>- Near the center of Oxford, for walking, lake, kids' splash park, <u>pool</u> (fee) and tennis courts.

<u>Oxford University Parks</u> – A green oasis in the heart of Oxford. Enjoy walks, ponds, Swift Tower nesting boxes for endangered swifts, and artfully-constructed bridges.

<u>Port Meadow</u>- A nearby Site of Special Scientific interest, with cattle, horses, and wildfowl for walking, picnicking, fishing, and swimming at your own risk.

<u>South Park</u>- 50 acres of open space with views of Oxford. Has a fitness trail and children's play area.

Also...Thames

There are several companies offering narrowboat and barge tours of Oxford's canals and the River Thames.

Boat Tours

Oxford River Cruises- Offers a range of specialty river cruisers, including afternoon tea cruise, picnic cruise, and evening cocktail cruise.

Punting

<u>Cherwell Boathouse</u>- Punting by the hour. Venture into the countryside or through University Parks. Punts hold up to 6 people. A £100 deposit and £20 per hour.

<u>Magdalen Bridge Boathouse</u>- Punting along the River Cherwell. Options for self-hire (£25-30 by the hour) or chauffeured (£35-40 per 30 mins.)

...and Trade (aka shopping!)

Small <u>grocery stores</u> nearby include Sainsbury's Local and Tesco Express, both on Magdalen St. A larger Sainsbury's is at 21 Westgate Street.

<u>Blackwell's Bookshop</u>- With several locations (including Broad St., near the Bodleian), a famous purveyor of new and rare books since 1846.

Boots Pharmacy- A British drugstore chain that carries lots of other essentials. 8-10 Cornmarket St.

<u>Clarendon Centre Oxford</u>- A small indoor shopping mall with clothing stores, cafes, and fast-food eateries at 51 Cornmarket St.

<u>The Covered Market</u>- a 1770s indoor bazaar with artisan grocers, boutiques, and cafes right around the corner.

<u>Oxfam</u> – With several locations, a unique bargain shop with clothes, gifts, and housewares sold for a good cause.

Westgate Oxford- A big, new mall easily-accessible from Lincoln College.
