IMMERSION IN LANGUAGE AND CULTURE

The Language Pledge®, pioneered by Middlebury's summer Language Schools, is a cornerstone of immersive language study and a key part of our study abroad programs. When students sign it, they pledge to speak only the language of their host country while there. Exceptions exist, but they are few.

By signing the pledge, students embrace both the challenge and authentic experience of a study abroad program in every respect—academic, social, and even professional when they undertake internships. Sticking to the pledge requires self-discipline, creativity, fearlessness in the face of mistakes, and



a sense of humor. The reward is rapid progress in gaining proficiency and self-confidence in language learning.

Many of our students major in areas other than foreign languages, yet all are committed to linguistic development and cultural immersion.

REAL-WORLD ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITY

With a few exceptions, courses are taught in the host country's language and conform to its educational approach. Universities in most other countries expect students to exercise a high degree of self-determination in their learning, and courses therefore may have a

different structure than U.S. students are used to. Students adjust to a new teaching style and way of learning, which is an education in itself. On-site Middlebury staff are there to help ease transitions as students navigate university systems and policies.

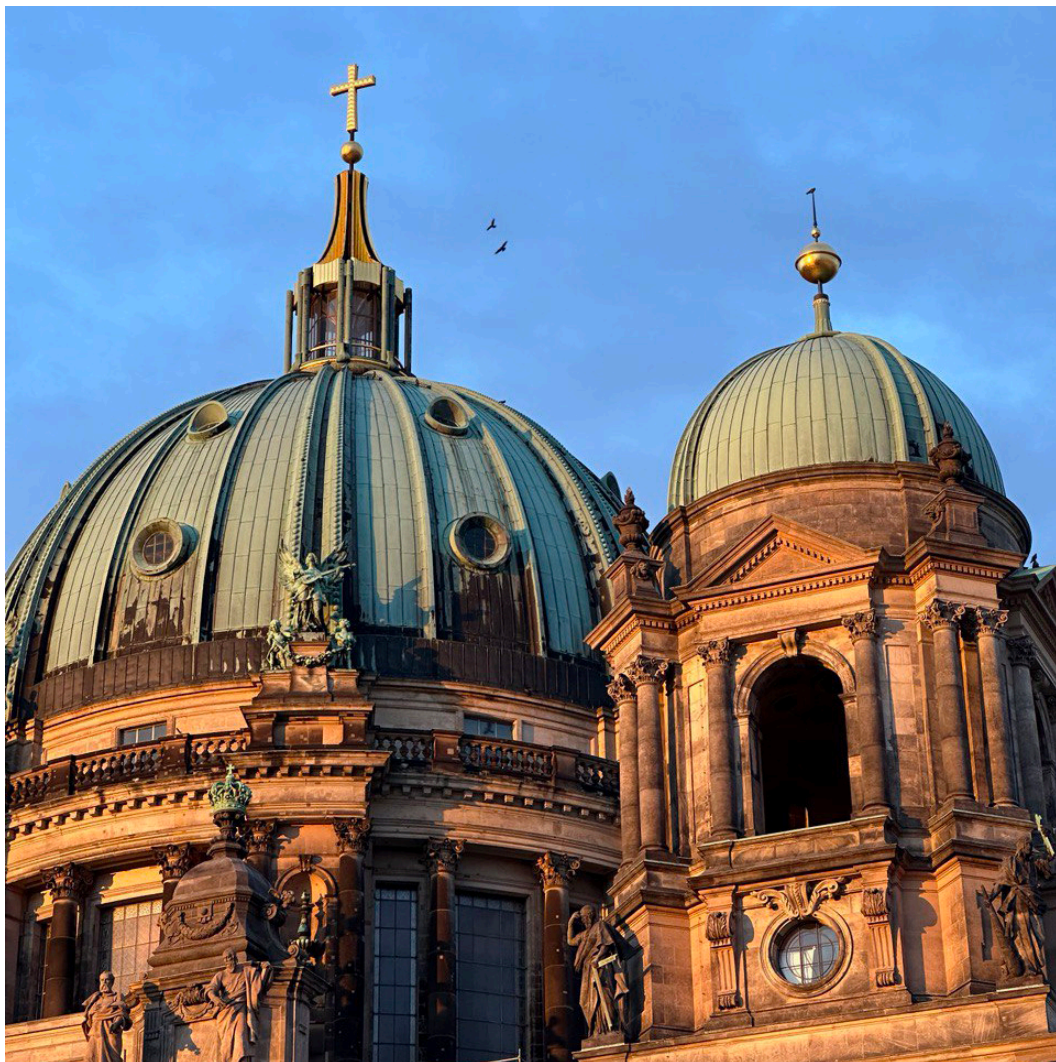

GUIDED INDEPENDENCE

An important part of the Middlebury study abroad experience is helping students discover their interests in a new place—engaging with their community, exploring culture and history, and making personal connections. We encourage students to take an active role in this process, learning to navigate on their own. At the same time, our on-site staff is there to support them all along the way. Internships and

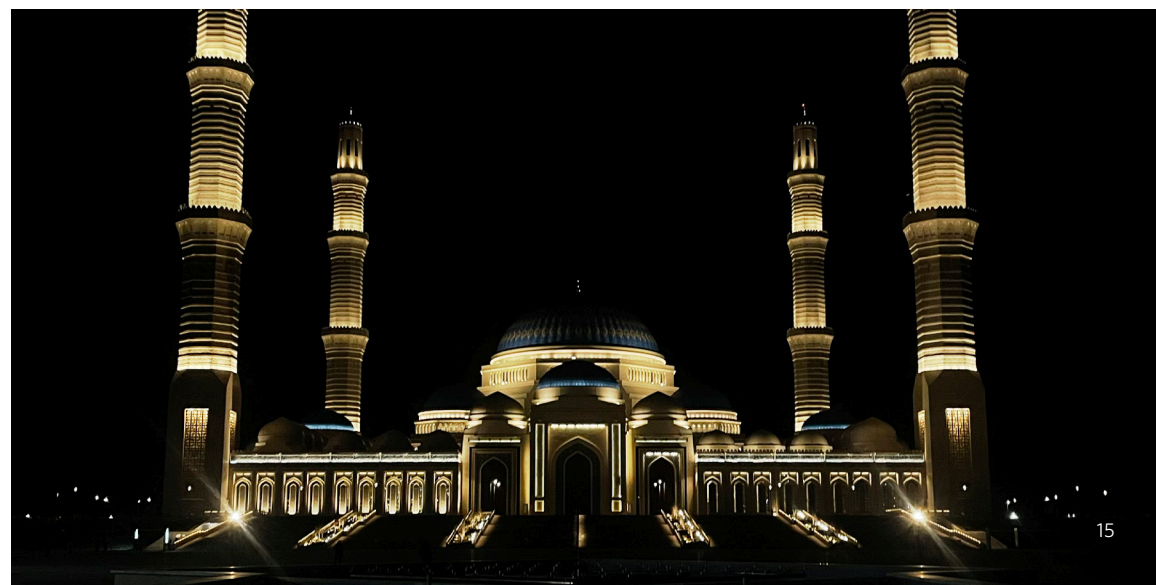

LANGUAGE SCHOOLS

Middlebury has led the world in full-immersion language studies since the launch of its first summer program in 1915. Today the Middlebury Language Schools offer seven- and eight-week summer sessions from beginner to advanced levels in 13 languages. Middlebury also offers graduate programs in Vermont, abroad, and online; these programs can be completed in 15 months or in four six-week summers.

The Middlebury Language Schools prepare students and teachers, scholars and artists, entrepreneurs and political leaders every summer to achieve their language goals and so much more, offering a year of college-level language learning (9–12 semester hours of credit) in one intensive summer. Before going abroad, students can gain the language skills and confidence necessary to function more independently. When returning from abroad, students can further their study of languages or begin graduate work.

All of our students pledge to communicate only in their language of study for their entire time in the program. With the Language Pledge®, students are immersed in language 24/7, enabling them to make remarkable progress in their studies. They are surrounded by world-class faculty who will help and support them both in and out of the classroom, joining them for meals and cocurricular in-language activities that enhance their cultural and contextual understanding.

Need-based financial aid and merit-based fellowships are available.

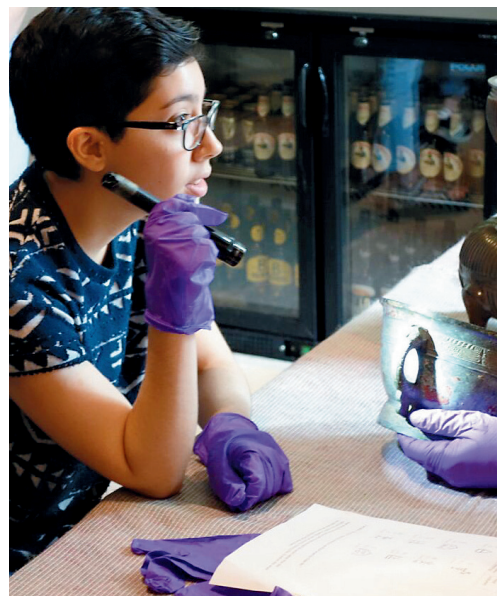

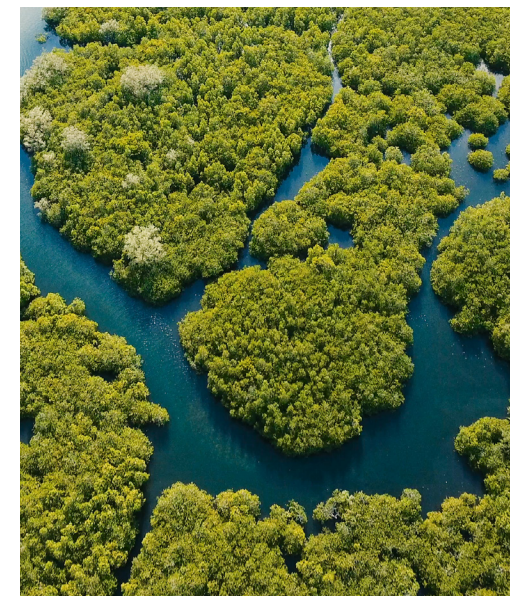

SCHOOL OF THE ENVIRONMENT

The Middlebury School of the Environment is a six-week summer environmental studies and leadership training program. Students take three courses investigating community-based sustainability initiatives. Past locations include Dali and Kunming, China, and Monterey, California. Stay tuned for information on upcoming program dates and locations.

Nationally recognized environmental faculty and mentors lead the interdisciplinary courses both in and out of the classroom. Students participate in leadership training workshops and field experiences to build a toolkit of leadership skills. The program awards three Middlebury units of credit (equivalent to nine semester hours of credit), and need- and merit-based financial aid is available.

STUDY AWAY AT MONTEREY

Undergraduates have the opportunity to spend a semester or a year at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies, a graduate school of Middlebury College. Students can draw from the extraordinary resources the Institute has to offer, including faculty who are active in their fields of international policy (environment, trade, development, and nonproliferation) and education. These programs educate students to advance understanding, promote peace, and drive change in pursuit of a more just world.

In addition to direct enrollment in Institute course work, students can design independent studies, participate in global courses, and work as graduate assistants. Excursions, led by Middlebury staff, encourage engagement with the community and environment in Monterey.

Students can use their Study Away at Monterey semester to work toward a master's degree at the Institute. By taking required courses during their Study Away semester, they are able to apply credit toward a master's and, in some cases, accelerate the degree.

ADMISSIONS

Students must have achieved at least an average of B in their major and language courses, and an overall average of B- (unless otherwise specified). Specific requirements for each program are available online.

APPLICATION FORMS AND DEADLINES

Fall semester and academic year applications are due March 15 (March 1 for Oxford). Spring semester applications are due September 15 for programs in France, Italy, Spain, Japan, and Oxford (October 1 for all other semester programs). We will consider late applications if space is available, provided that visa deadlines (where applicable) can be met. Middlebury College students must apply by February 1 of the preceding year. Applications are accepted on a rolling admissions basis until the final deadline, but some programs fill before the deadline.

FINANCIAL AID

We offer a limited number of scholarships to students who come from colleges and universities other than Middlebury.
