IMMERSION IN LANGUAGE AND CULTURE

The Language Pledge®, pioneered by Middlebury's summer Language Schools, is a cornerstone of immersive language study and a key part of our study abroad programs. When students sign it, they pledge to speak only the language of their host country while there. Exceptions exist, but they are few.

By signing the pledge, students embrace both the challenge and authentic experience of a study abroad program in every respect—academic, social, and even professional when they undertake internships. Sticking to the pledge requires self-discipline, creativity, fearlessness in the face of mistakes, and

a sense of humor. The reward is rapid progress in gaining proficiency and self-confidence in language learning.

Many of our students major in areas other than foreign languages, yet all are committed to linguistic development and cultural immersion.

With a few exceptions, courses are taught in the host country's language and conform to its educational approach. Universities in most other countries expect students to exercise a high degree of self-determination in their learning, and courses therefore may have a



LANGUAGE SCHOOLS

Middlebury has led the world in full-immersion language studies since the launch of its first summer program in 1915. Today the Middlebury Language Schools offer seven- and eight-week summer sessions from beginner to advanced levels in 13 languages. Middlebury also offers graduate programs in Vermont, abroad, and online; these programs can be completed in 15 months or in four six-week summers.

The Middlebury Language Schools prepare students and teachers, scholars and artists, entrepreneurs and political leaders every summer to achieve their language goals and so much more, offering a year of college-level language learning (9–12 semester hours of credit) in one intensive summer. Before going abroad, students can gain the language skills and confidence necessary to function more independently. When returning from abroad, students can further their study of languages or begin graduate work.

SCHOOL OF THE ENVIRONMENT

The Middlebury School of the Environment is a six-week summer environmental studies and leadership training program. Students take three courses investigating community-based sustainability initiatives. Past locations include Dali and Kunming, China, and Monterey, California. Stay tuned for information on upcoming program dates and locations.

Nationally recognized environmental faculty and mentors lead the interdisciplinary courses both in and out of the classroom. Students participate in leadership training workshops and field experiences to build a toolkit of leadership skills. The program awards three Middlebury units of credit (equivalent to nine semester hours of credit), and need- and merit-based financial aid is available.

STUDY AWAY AT MONTEREY

Undergraduates have the opportunity to spend a semester or a year at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies, a graduate school of Middlebury College. Students can draw from the extraordinary resources the Institute has to offer, including faculty active in the fields of international development, environmental policy, global security, social impact, and languages. These programs educate students to advance understanding, promote peace, and drive change in pursuit of a more just world.

In addition to direct enrollment in Institute course work, students can design independent studies, participate in global courses, and work as graduate assistants. Excursions, led by Middlebury staff, encourage engagement with the community and environment in Monterey.

Language Schools

Through the Middlebury Language Schools, students can obtain a Master of Arts (MA), Master of Arts (MA) in Applied Languages, or Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) with Licensure.

Students can complete an MA in Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Russian, or Spanish over four six-week summers in Vermont or one or two six-week summers combined with an academic year in France, Germany, Italy, Kazakhstan, or Spain. Hebrew, Japanese, and Korean have online options.

The MA in Applied Languages is available in French, German, and Italian. Students spend one six-week summer in Vermont followed by an academic year abroad paired with an international internship.

The MAT is offered in Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, and Spanish. Students spend one six-week summer in Vermont, an academic year online, a second summer in Vermont, and a final teaching practicum in their preferred place of residence.

Students must have achieved at least an average of B in their major and language courses, and an overall average of B- (unless otherwise specified). Specific requirements for each program are available online.

Fall semester and academic year applications are due March 1. Spring semester applications are due September 15 for programs in France, Italy, Spain, Japan, and the UK (October 1 for all other semester programs). We will consider late applications if space is available, provided that visa deadlines (where applicable) can be met. Middlebury College students must apply by February 1 of the preceding year. Applications are accepted on a rolling admissions basis until the final deadline, but some programs fill before the deadline.
