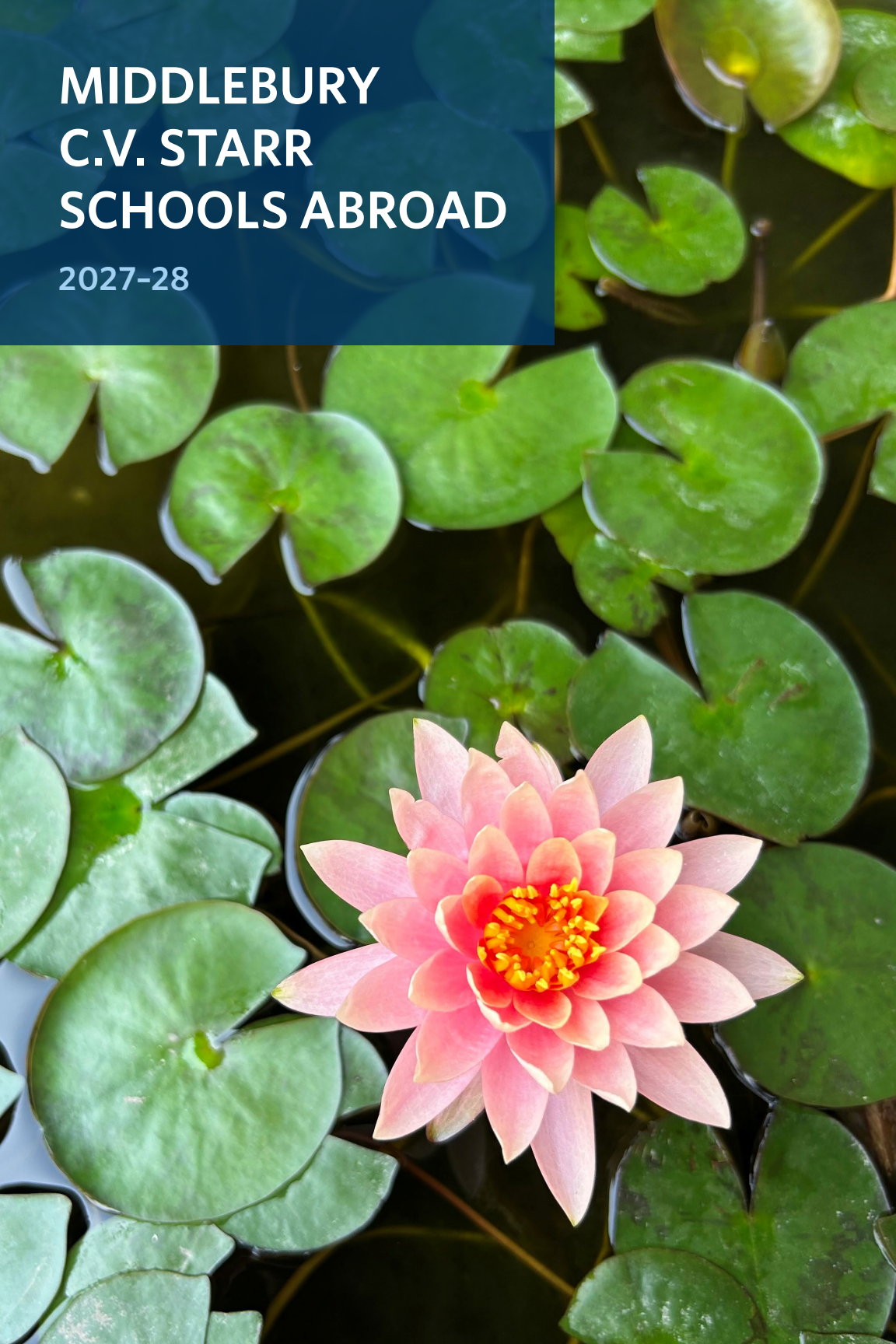

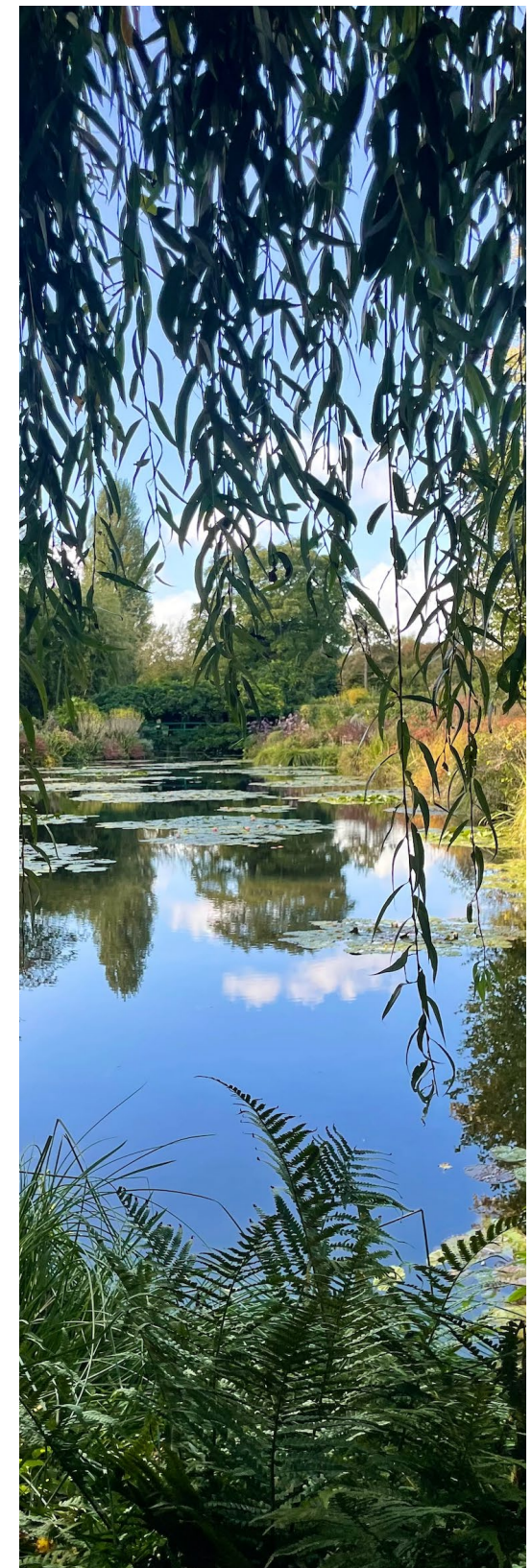

## IMMERSION IN LANGUAGE AND CULTURE

The Language Pledge®, pioneered by Middlebury's summer Language Schools, is a cornerstone of immersive language study and a key part of our study abroad programs. When students sign it, they pledge to speak only the language of their host country while there. Exceptions exist, but they are few.

By signing the pledge, students embrace both the challenge and authentic experience of a study abroad program in every respect—academic, social, and even professional when they undertake internships. Sticking to the pledge requires self-discipline, creativity, fearlessness in the face of mistakes, and



a sense of humor. The reward is rapid progress in gaining proficiency and self-confidence in language learning.

Many of our students major in areas other than foreign languages, yet all are committed to linguistic development and cultural immersion.

## REAL-WORLD ACADEMIC OPPORTUNITY

With a few exceptions, courses are taught in the host country's language and conform to its educational approach. Universities in most other countries expect students to exercise a high degree of self-determination in their learning, and courses therefore may have a

different structure than U.S. students are used to. Students adjust to a new teaching style and way of learning, which is an education in itself. On-site Middlebury staff are there to help ease transitions as students navigate university systems and policies.

## GUIDED INDEPENDENCE

An important part of the Middlebury study abroad experience is helping students discover their interests in a new place—engaging with their community, exploring culture and history, and making personal connections. **Housing** Homestays. Full-year students in their second semester may move into independent apartments.

**Academics** Middlebury-organized courses in Modern Standard Arabic and Jordanian Colloquial Arabic (Ammiyya), literature, and translation, Jordanian and Middle Eastern politics, religion, economics, gender studies, civil society, and refugee and migration studies. Internships and direct-enroll options are available in the second semester.

## SCHOOL IN MOROCCO

**City** Rabat  
**Population** 600,000



**Housing** Homestays. Full-year students in their second semester may move into independent apartments.

**Academics** **Intermediate Track:** Modern Standard Arabic, Moroccan Colloquial Arabic (Daarija), and two elective courses. Elective courses begin in English with increasing instruction in Arabic.

**Advanced Track:** Modern Standard Arabic, Moroccan Colloquial Arabic (Daarija), one elective course in Moroccan and MENA culture, literature, religion, anthropology, or politics, and a one-on-one content course. All coursework is conducted in Arabic.

**Academics in Bordeaux** One history course arranged by Middlebury and one French language course are required. For remaining courses, direct enrollment at a local university alongside French students in a variety of liberal arts subjects.

# MIDDLEBURY SUMMER PROGRAMS

## LANGUAGE SCHOOLS

Middlebury has led the world in full-immersion language studies since the launch of its first summer program in 1915. Today the Middlebury Language Schools offer seven- and eight-week summer sessions from beginner to advanced levels in 12 languages. Middlebury also offers graduate programs in Vermont, abroad, and online; these programs can be completed in 15 months or in four six-week summers.

The Middlebury Language Schools prepare students and teachers, scholars and artists, entrepreneurs and political leaders every summer to achieve their language goals and so much more, offering a year of college-level language learning (9-12 semester hours of credit) in one intensive summer. Before going abroad, students can gain the language skills and confidence necessary to function more independently. When returning from abroad, students can further their study of languages or begin graduate work.

All of our students pledge to communicate only in their language of study for their entire time in the program. With the Language Pledge®, students are immersed in language 24/7, enabling them to make remarkable progress in their studies. They are surrounded by world-class faculty who will help and support them both in and out of the classroom, joining them for meals and cocurricular in-language activities that enhance their cultural and contextual understanding.

Need-based financial aid and merit-based fellowships are available.

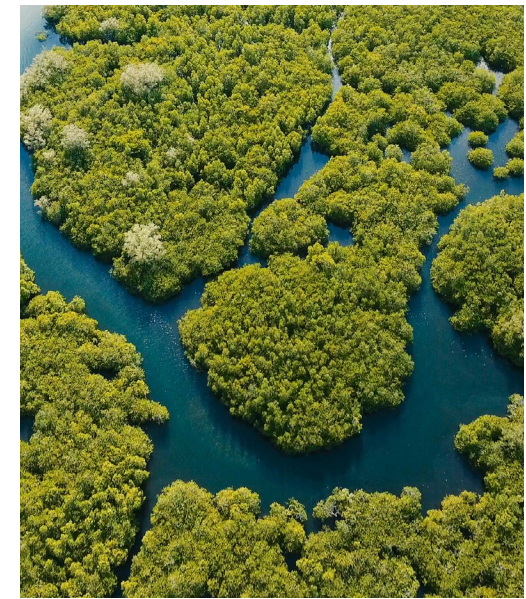


## MUSEUM STUDIES IN OXFORD

# FUNDING & SCHOLARSHIPS

**Cason Scholarship:** Awarded in memory of Jeffrey W. Cason, who served as dean of International Programs at Middlebury College for nine years, this scholarship is in recognition of his lifelong passion for international teaching, learning, and study abroad. Students from colleges and universities other than Middlebury are eligible for this \$4,000 award.

**Funded Research Opportunities:** The Middlebury Schools Abroad are proud to support the work of the Kathryn Wasserman Davis Collaborative in Conflict Transformation through thematic coursework, excursions, and research abroad. Selected spring semester students will receive a \$2,000 research stipend. Separate application required.

**Cameroon:** Students in Yaoundé can work alongside Professor Éric Fofack at the Center for Gender, Peace, and Security (CGPS), supporting his research on women's representation in Cameroonian media. Through their research, students gain a more nuanced understanding of the social, political, and cultural environment in Cameroon.

**Morocco:** Students in Rabat can work as research assistants under the guidance of Professor Hassan Belhiah. Through statistical analysis, historical research, and first-hand accounts, students explore how language can serve as both an instigator and a tool for transformation in conflicts both past and present.

### LANGUAGE SCHOOLS

Through the Middlebury Language Schools, students can obtain a Master of Arts (MA), Master of Arts (MA) in Applied Languages, or Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) with Licensure.

Middlebury may meet up to 100 percent of demonstrated need (including tuition, housing, and food) depending on the graduate degree program.

Students can complete an MA in Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Russian, or Spanish over four six-week summers in Vermont or one or two six-week summers combined with an academic year in France, Germany, Italy, Kazakhstan, or Spain. Arabic, Chinese, Hebrew, Japanese, and Korean have online options.

The MA in Applied Languages is available in French, German, and Italian. Students spend one six-week summer in Vermont followed by an academic year abroad paired with an international internship.

The MAT is offered in Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, and Spanish. Students spend one six-week summer in Vermont, an academic year online, a second summer in Vermont, and a final teaching practicum in their preferred place of residence.

## APPLICATION FORMS AND DEADLINES

Fall semester and academic year applications are due March 1. Spring semester applications are due September 15 for programs in France, Italy, Spain, Japan, and the UK (October 1 for all other semester programs). We will consider late applications if space is available, provided that visa deadlines (where applicable) can be met. Middlebury College students must apply by February 1 of the preceding year. Applications are accepted on a rolling admissions basis until the final deadline, but some programs fill before the deadline.
