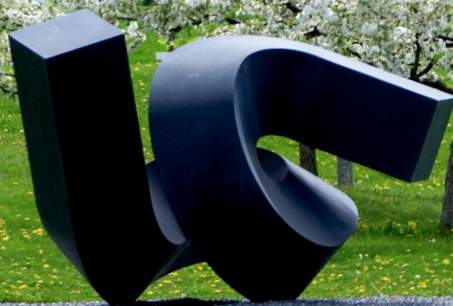




Welcome to Your 50th Reunion!



Important Information for the 50th Reunion Class

ARRIVAL AND CHECK-IN

Check-in for your class will begin at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 8. You can go directly to your class headquarters in Forest Hall. There are three parking spots in front of Forest Hall for you to drop off your luggage. Student hosts will be there to help you manage your things and to direct you to the best place to park.

At your headquarters, you will get your name tag (which also serves as your meal ticket), an up-to-date schedule of events, a 50th gold ribbon for your cane, your room key if you are staying on campus, a class gift, and any additional class or event information.

Whether or not you are staying on campus, you must check in at your class headquarters to get your registration packet and name tag.

We encourage you to arrive as early as possible on Thursday to allow yourself time to get settled in and attend events in the morning with your class.

CLASS HOUSING AND HEADQUARTERS

Reunion Class of 1973 will be housed in Forest Hall, and your headquarters will be in the East Lounge. Most Forest rooms are set up with “sink mates” consisting of two singles with a connecting sink in between. Bathrooms are shared. A pillow, sheets, a blanket, and a towel are provided. It may be helpful to bring things like an extra blanket, reading lamp, or small fan with you. Forest does have an elevator for getting to the upper floors.

PARKING

When you arrive on campus, please park only in designated faculty, staff, or visitor parking spaces. A few ADA-accessible spaces are also available for those with appropriate plates or permits. **A parking pass for your car is included with this mailing;** please complete it and place it on your dashboard when you park. If you forget to bring this pass, extras will be available at your headquarters in Forest Hall.

During drop-off times, you may unload your suitcases in front of Forest, but **you may not leave your car there or in any designated “No Parking” area for an extended period.** There is no long-term parking along College Street. During check-in, you will be directed to designated parking areas (Lots M and R), and shuttles will be available to take you back to your headquarters.

ON-CAMPUS TRANSPORTATION

Middlebury’s beautiful campus can be a bit challenging to navigate. Please see the campus map included in this mailing, which shows shuttles circulating the campus on Friday and Saturday (marked with the red line). Buses will be available on Saturday evening for transportation to and from the all-class dinner, and we will have dedicated vans and golf carts available for those who need assistance at other times. Please request transportation at your headquarters.

DINING

Meals will be provided throughout the weekend on campus from Thursday lunch through Sunday breakfast. **Please wear your name tag to all meals.**

On *Thursday* night, you will attend a reception at the president's home at 3 South Street (bus transportation will be available; please meet the bus at Adirondack Circle at 4:45 p.m.). After the reception, you will be bussed back to campus for a formal dinner at Ross.

On *Friday* night, there will be dinner and evening entertainment at the tent closest to the patio behind the Mahaney Arts Center (MAC). After dinner, a local DJ will be spinning the tunes you choose, right there at your 50th tent.

The *Saturday* night all-class dinner and reception under the tents behind the Mahaney Arts Center is a weekend highlight. Fireworks at dusk are followed by the Grift, a favorite Reunion Weekend band.

PACKING

Don't forget to pack your cane and water bottle. While masks are not required now, please pack one if you might be more comfortable having one available. Don't forget your golfing and hiking gear if you plan to enjoy those events.

The Thursday night reception with President Laurie L. Patton is the dressiest event—many men wear ties and jackets, and ladies wear dresses or pants. “Vermont casual” is the attire for the rest of the weekend; comfortable walking shoes are best. Remember to bring layers, seasonal clothing, and in case of rain, waterproof shoes. Again, please pack a water bottle to use over the weekend; there are many water stations around campus for refilling bottles.
