Composed of nearly 20 works that make use of discarded materials, *Tossed* explores themes of aesthetics, social/political commentary, and cultural reference juxtaposing contemporary works—by artists such as Swoon, Richard Stankiewicz, El Anatsui, Romuald Hazoumè, Melvin Edwards, and Betye Saar—with artists' statements and contextual insights about our throwaway society.




